Dear Flemington-Raritan Regional School District Parents and Community Members,

On Thursday, February 29, 2024, it is anticipated that the Board of Education will approve my recommendation for Dr. Clifford Burns to be the Assistant Superintendent of the Flemington-Raritan Regional School District. Dr. Burns will replace Mr. Daniel Bland, who has retired. Dr. Burns' anticipated start date is March 1.

With 20 years of experience in education, Dr. Burns is an educational leader and champion of student success. He began his career in education teaching 4th- and 5th-grades in New York City. He advanced into administration in New Jersey school districts, first as an assistant principal in Stanhope and Vernon, then as an elementary principal in Randolph. In 2021, Dr. Burns was appointed Superintendent of Schools in Andover.

Reflecting on his transition to Flemington-Raritan, Dr. Burns shared, *"I am truly grateful to be joining the team of dynamic educators in the Flemington-Raritan School District. I am also thankful to Dr. McGann, the hiring committee, and our Board of Education members for their confidence in me to serve as FRSD's next Assistant Superintendent of Schools. Dr. Burns earned a bachelor's degree in elementary education and a master's degree in inclusive education with gifted extension from Nyack College. He earned a second master's degree and a doctorate degree in educational leadership, management and policy from Seton Hall University. He is committed to supporting faculty and staff, developing a positive school climate, providing school leadership and vision and working collaboratively to ensure student success.
