Dear Flemington-Raritan Regional School District Parents, Staff, and Community Members,

The District received notice of a positive COVID-19 case of a Reading-Fleming Intermediate School staff member who was last in the building on March 17 and of a Copper Hill School student who was last in the building on March 12. Our District nurses follow all contact tracing guidelines from the Department of Health. We are not able to share any other identifying information about positive cases due to the Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA).

Whenever contact tracing determines that your child or a member of our staff or faculty has been in contact with an ill person, our district nurses will communicate guidance to all those that are determined to need to quarantine. This process starts immediately with the reporting of the case. We continue to have staff, faculty, and students that must quarantine due to positive cases. Please remember to wear a mask, wash your hands, practice social distancing, and follow all health and hygiene recommendations. The goal to keep our school doors open for our community requires that everyone take precautions to slow the spread of COVID-19.

The district follows recommendations from the New Jersey Department of Health. While COVID activity in Hunterdon County remains high, schools should continue to exclude staff and students if they have:

- <u>Tested positive</u> (viral test) for COVID-19 Confirmed cases of COVID-19 should stay home until at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset and at least 24 hours have passed after the resolution of fever without fever-reducing medications and improvement in symptoms.
- <u>COVID-19</u> compatible symptoms All individuals with COVID-19 compatible symptoms who have <u>not</u> been tested should stay home until at least 10 days have passed since symptom onset and at least 24 hours have passed after the resolution of fever without fever-reducing medications and improvement in symptoms. An alternate diagnosis (including a positive strep test or influenza swab) without a negative COVID-19 test is not acceptable for individuals who meet COVID-19 exclusion criteria to return to school.
- Potential exposure to COVID-19- Close contact with a person with COVID-19 in the past 14 days require an exclusion period based on Regional Risk levels. When the region is "High" (orange) exposed close contacts should be excluded from school for 14 days. "Moderate or Low" (yellow or green) exposed contacts should be excluded from school for 10 days (or 7 days with negative test results collected at 5-7 days using a "viral test" otherwise known as a PCR test or molecular test, not a diagnostic test such as the rapid antigen test.) Currently, our region is "High" (orange). According to the Hunterdon County Health Department, when our region is in the High COVID activity level, the 14 day quarantine time frame is recommended. Any deviation of the 14-day quarantine recommendation is evaluated on a case-by-case basis and only considered if the 14 days are not feasible due to extenuating hardship. Questions should be directed to the school nurse.
- Engaged in domestic and/or international travel in the past 10 days (exclude in accordance with NJ Travel Recommendations and essential employees).
- Siblings of a student who has symptoms and meets COVID-19 Exclusion Criteria should be excluded from school until the symptomatic individual receives a negative test result. If the symptomatic individual tests positive, the sibling is required to self-quarantine.

We are in our first week of combined cohorts. It is important that we all continue to avoid close contact situations in which we are unmasked. We must also continue to follow quarantine recommendations in New Jersey's travel advisory. Behavior that is not in alignment with all precautions and recommendations will threaten our ability to offer in-person instruction and our athletics programs at the middle school. We do not want to see an increase to the levels that we saw after Thanksgiving and winter break. During that time the District struggled to keep our doors open for students due to the number of staff, faculty, and students that needed to quarantine. We do not want to be forced to take steps backwards. We have not had to step back from any of our reopening strategies to date, and we are hopeful that increased availability of vaccines and the implementation of safety protocols in our schools will prevent that in the future.
