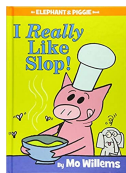

This month, Kindergarten worked on their prediction skills, learned about how illustrators worked and created their own illustrations. First grade also worked on prediction and story elements. Second grade had a change to discuss the differences between facts and opinions (and robots), create monster characters and discuss story elements. Third graders examined how characters can change, identified character traits, while fourth graders continued gleaning information from nonfiction texts. Third and fourth grader also reviewed call numbers and completed a scavenger hunt in the library!

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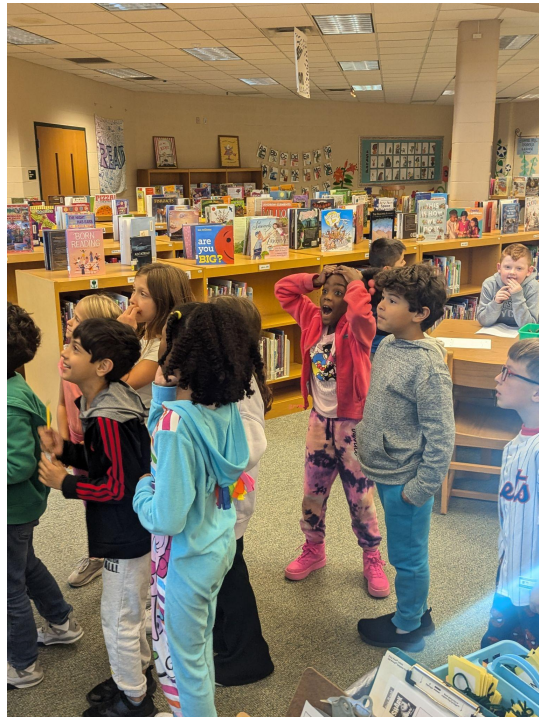

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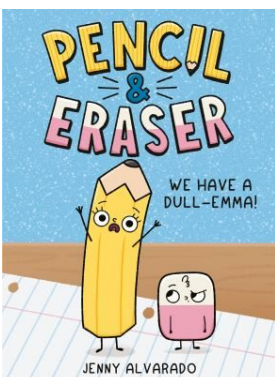
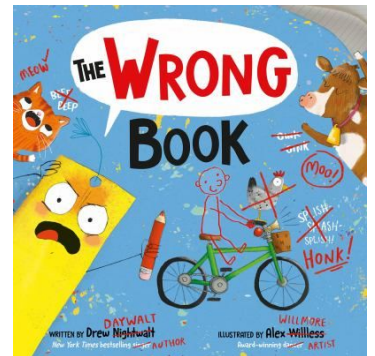
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NEW BOOKS ADDED THIS MONTH!
