Mr. Davidson read the following statement:

The Board deeply regrets the occurrence which took place at the August 31, 2015 Board of Education meeting. We recognize how this could be thought of as insensitive towards the mental health community. We want you to know that this does not substantively reflect the attitude of the Board regarding the issue of mental health and our Superintendent has been personally speaking to many individuals and organizations in an effort to completely understand and address all the concerns expressed.

We, as a Board, also wish to acknowledge the work of Assemblywoman Donna Simon. We are grateful for her efforts to advocate for education issues in the State of New Jersey.

Dr. Caulfield explained that she has spoken personally with each concerned person including NAMI. She has a heightened sensitivity because of her own family issues. She was pleased to have had the opportunity to speak in person to those offended. Ms. Markowski explained her mistake and stated "she did not mean to be insensitive."

#### CITIZENS ADDRESS THE BOARD

Mr. Davidson read the following statement regarding public comment pursuant to N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(a), the Open Public Meetings Act. Members of the public are invited to address the Board according to the Board's policy and bylaws. Please be aware that this portion is your opportunity to comment, and is not a forum for the Board to respond to your comments. However, the Board will certainly give all comments appropriate consideration.

Kathy Kolvites, Barley Sheaf Nurse & Tommie Lou Judson, Robert Hunter Nurse, expressed their concerns regarding Policy 5330. They outlined their concerns. They recognized that revisions can be made later but asked that the item be tabled. They requested a meeting with the Policy Committee.

Mr. Comegno explained that the proposed revisions are not related to the nurses concerns, and refer to other language in the Policy relating to certain legal matters. He noted that those concerns could go to the Policy Committee. Dr. Caulfield noted that she does welcome future recommendations. She could not incorporate changes for this evenings meeting.

Kathy Kolvites, Nurse, noted the last time the Policy was revised the nurses requested recommendations and were ignored.

Sue Vala, FREA President, stated that the FREA opposes the secretarial job description changes on the agenda and felt that it was disrespectful to not discuss these with the Union in a timelier manner. She further noted that it was disrespectful to all other school secretaries.

#### SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

Dr. Caulfield visited all school openings. She noted it was an amazing experience. Dr. Caulfield noted she had a meeting with the Administrators to set up an evaluation system. Dr. Caulfield noted that we are working on a new Board Agenda process. She also spoke with NAMI and many other people about mental illness. Dr. Caulfield met with the Flemington Borough Police and the Federal Officer from the U.S. Postal Service. We will be revising the mail policy. Dr. Caulfield is working to coordinate schedules for open houses so she can attend. Dr. Caulfield met with the Police Chiefs to review the Memorandum of Agreement. Dr. Caulfield noted that a professional development day was held. She appreciated all who attended. Dr. Caulfield, Mr. Bland and Ms. Voorhees are beginning to discuss the budget. Dr. Caulfield and Mr. Bland are meeting regularly to discuss expanding Curriculum. Dr. Caulfield attended Round Table for the County. She met with the Joint PTO. She will be meeting with the FREF and noted that she supports Comedy Night to raise money. She noted that she is looking to update the Special Education Program.

## **CORRESPONDENCE**

Ms. Fallon noted she had received the following correspondence:

- 1. Letter from a resident inquiring about fundraising opportunities. The board has responded.
- 2. Several letters from citizens and advocacy groups with concerns about our position on mental health issues. Dr. Caulfield has reached out to those individuals.
- 3. Certified letter from a Raritan Township resident to Alan Brewer which appeared to be personal in nature. No response from the Board was required. We would like to remind the public that the board office should not be used for personal business. Please limit correspondence mailed to the Board office to school district business only.
- 4. A letter was received addressed to Alan Brewer at the Board Office from another NJ public school with a denied OPRA request for their school security plan. No response from the Board was required.
- 5. Finally, 10 letters were received from Alan Brewer. One to each board member, including to himself, and one to Dr. Caulfield. The letters, in part, challenged the opening of his mail by the board secretary. In addition to the letters, federal and local complaints were apparently made against individuals and the district by Mr. Brewer. Considerable research and resources, which approached \$10K of taxpayer money, were required to resolve the challenge and close the complaints in favor of the district. This 10 K dollars does not include resources and time spent by the local law enforcement and the federal postal authority. The investigation verified that the procedures followed by the Board office as it regards the mail handling were appropriate.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

Ms. Markowski finished her comment from the prior discussion and apologized to anyone who was offended by her mistake at the August 31<sup>st</sup> Board Meeting.

Mr. Brewer attempted to respond to Ms. Fallon's "allegations" as he stated. Ms. Fallon explained that she did not make any allegations. She stated that the correspondence that was received was fact surrounding the challenge by Mr. Brewer regarding the handling of his mail. Mr. Brewer attempted to read a letter into the record. Mr. Davidson stated there was no need to read anything into the record. Mr. Brewer insisted. Mr. Davidson then allowed Mr. Brewer to continue. Mr. Comegno attempted to speak. Mr. Brewer stated, "you are an employee of this Board, no one asked you a question, so please don't interrupt me again". Mr. Comegno then stated "that the President, you elected, asked me to impress upon the Board the concern for public discussion of personnel matters". Mr. Brewer continued to speak over Mr. Comegno. Mr. Comegno objected to the discussion. Mr. Brewer asked Mr. Comegno "when did the President ask you to discuss." Ms. Voorhees suggested to Mr. Davidson that we adjourn the meeting to avoid further conflict. Mr. Brewer stated "what do you mean adjourn the meeting, there you go Stephanie, telling the Board President how to run his meeting". Mr. Davidson stated to Mr. Brewer that he may not read a letter about personnel or confidential matters. Mr. Brewer stated he had a right to go on record since Ms. Fallon had brought up the personnel matter. Mr. Davidson explained that she only shared that correspondence that was received. Mr. Brewer then got up from his chair, climbed over the auditorium seats and began distributing a letter. Mr. Comegno stood up and expressed concern. Mr. Davidson asked Mr. Brewer to please be seated two times, told him he was out of order and used the gavel. Mr. Brewer stated he has a right to speak. Mr. Davidson noted he gave him an opportunity to speak. Mr. Davidson then attempted to move on to the next item without success. Mr. Brewer kept speaking over Mr. Davidson. Mr. Brewer didn't feel he had an opportunity to speak because he keeps getting interrupted. Mr. Davidson attempted to explain to Mr. Brewer the issue's concerning confidential personnel matters. Mr. Brewer kept shouting he had a right to speak. Dr. Caulfield stated that "this is getting a little out of hand", she further stated that "people are getting a little apprehensive about the lack of decorum of the Board." Mr. Brewer asked to read his letter. Dr. Caulfield cautioned him about speaking about personnel matters and violating people's rights. Mr. Brewer stated he felt his rights were violated by Ms. Fallon when the correspondence received was read into the record. Ms. Fallon stated correspondence is a public record. Mr. Brewer continued to insist on reading his letter. Mr. Davidson noted that the Board did not review the correspondence and that he was not going to read it publicly. Mr. Brewer continued to demand he read his letter. Mr. Davidson called Mr. Brewer out of order again and asked him to cease and desist (gavel). Mr. Davidson attempted to move on to the next item of business when Mr. Brewer interrupted. He stated he was denied the right to speak. Mr. Comegno clarified that Mr. Brewer's letter will become part of the minutes. Mr. Brewer attempted to tell the Board what should be in the minutes. He then stated that "it better be reflected that what I gave tonight to this Board, Stephanie and appropriately written in the minutes, that what I gave you was a letter dated, September 21, 2015." Ms. Voorhees stated "I don't take directives from individual Board Members, so if this Board would like to direct me they need to make a motion to do so." Mr. Comegno attempted to speak but Mr. Brewer spoke over him about a certified letter that he claims was withheld from him for 4 days. Mr. Davidson and Mr. Comegno attempted to speak. Mr. Brewer stated that a letter he wrote to "every Board Member was withheld." He then stated that his rights were violated. Mr. Davidson interrupted and stated that he has failed in his attempt to assume the Board is in error. Mr. Brewer said that "is your opinion". Mr. Davidson stated that was not his opinion, it was the opinion of the U.S. Postal Service. Mr. Brewer then suggested that we take action against the postal service. Mr. Davidson called for a motion to adjourn (gavel).

On the motion of Ms. Fallon, seconded by Dr. Kenny, the meeting was abruptly adjourned at 8:01 p.m. viva voce.
