Background January 2012

As a result of the committee's findings, the Flemington-Raritan Education Foundation was formally established as a...

- Volunteer, nonprofit organization 501(c)(3) pending
- Dedicated to supporting innovative educational programs that are not supported by the district's budget
- For the benefit of public school and eligible homeschooled children from pre-K to 8th grade in the Flemington-Raritan School District
- Support of these programs will be awarded through a systematic grant process
- Fundraising will target businesses and key individuals that value supporting excellence in education

Through these programs and initiatives the foundation will strive to:

- Build long-term partnerships
- Collaborate with organizations, companies and individuals

Flemington-Raritan Education Foundation The Flemington-Raritan Education Foundation is a nonprofit organization committed to supporting innovative and enriching programs.


These programs will enhance existing educational opportunities for children from pre-K through eighth grade.








Structure

Officers and trustees are elected by the board for a term of two years and are responsible for the overall management of the foundation.


