Language Development & Reading...and some fun fine motor projects

We are learning so much. This week we...

~ had lots of fun reenacting the story <u>We're Going on a Bear</u> ~ used our cutting and coloring skills to make a cute bear with our KPALs.

~ used positional words to create settings for bears that we then colored and decorated. These are on display outside our classroom.

~found the trick word "I' in our morning message and in our poem.

~learned about how to organize our classroom books. We have lots of books so this will be a project we keep working on in the coming weeks.

~learned how to handle books gently and take good care of them.

~had lots of fun self-selecting more books for our reading bins and then even more fun discovering the wonders found within those books

~In Fundations we learned about the letters: n~nut~/n/ and m~man~/m/, practiced writing the lowercase letters n, m, t, b, f on our dry erase boards, played a game identifying the initial sounds in words that start with n, m, t, b & f and we built and echo read some sentences.

~<u>Phonemic Awareness</u>: We have also been honing our phonemic awareness by verbalizing rhyming words, isolating initial and final sounds in words, combining and separating compound words and changing parts of words to create new words.
