Language Development & Reading:

~We looked for the <u>Word of the Week</u>: "in" in our books and messages and practiced writing and spelling it as well. ~We continued to read a variety of ABC books this week and enjoyed identifying lots of interesting things by focusing on initial sounds.

~We worked on emergent literacy skills by using small readers and focusing on one-to-one correspondence, recognizing high frequency words, using initial sounds and also picture cues. We have started to bring home our **PURPLE** reading bags. If your child brings their bag home, please enjoy the book with them, sign the paper in the bag, and return it to school the next day. ~We had opportunities to keep enjoying the books in our book bins and this week we spent time returning and then getting new books.

~We listened to <u>There Was an Old Lady Who Swallowed Some</u> <u>Leaves</u>, identified a favorite part & drew a picture to illustrate it. ~We continued to write in lots of ways during Writing Workshop. This week we were all able to add lots of letters and labeling to our wonderful pictures and stories.

~We continued our Fundations Literacy Program. This week we introduced the letters: a~apple~/a/and g~game~/g/. We are learning to match letters with their sounds, write letters on our dry erase slates and we also helped retell a story about Mama Echo hunting for food.



Math:

~We compared 5 and 10 frames, built quantities on counting mats (frames) using unifix cubes and determined how many more we would need to make 10.

~By playing Count & Compare, we compared sets of up to 10 objects to determine which were sets contained less and which contained more.

~In math Work Places we've been playing games and exploring manipulatives that have let us create patterns, practice numeral writing, develop subitizing skills and decompose 5.



Social Studies/Science:

~In Social Studies we spent time learning how to be problem solvers. We identified situations that could be problematic, either in school, and for some at home, and brainstormed ways to help create better outcomes.

~We began to lay plans for our unit culminating "Take Action" project. We are very excited to work on this project next week and help make Barley Sheaf a great place for everyone. Stay tuned for more details. Family Fun Ideas
