Language Development & Reading:

~We looked for the Word of the Week: **my** in our poem, books and messages.

~We began to write a variety of stories as part of our new writing unit "Pattern Books."

~We hunted for, and added in, letters and words in our Morning Message.

~During Literacy Centers we worked on

- practiced recognizing and writing the letters e & r, and learning the sounds that these letters make.
- explored books on Epic! and practiced letter writing using Letter School on our iPads.
- read emergent readers about Fall.
- identified beginning sounds in words.
- worked on developing phonemic awareness skills by blending sounds into words and identifying and creating rhyming words.

~Fundations - This week's letters: e~Ed~/e/and r~rat~/r/. We are learning to match letters with their sounds, write letters on our dry erase slates and attend to stories. We also practiced discriminating the number of words in a sentence.




Social Studies/Science:

~In Science we continued to be weather watchers and this week we focused on wind and clouds.

~We read books about clouds. We learned that there are 3 main types of cloud (cirrus, cumulous and stratus). We also saw a number of contrail clouds throughout the week.

~We created a model of the different types of cloud cover that weather watchers might refer to while keeping track of the weather.
