Language Development & Reading:

~We looked for the Word of the Week: **<u>the</u>** in our books and messages.

~We continued writing pattern books. This week we wrote books about the Weather. We have been working really hard to stretch out sounds in words and also use the trick (sight) words that we've learned.

~We chorally and partner read our Shared Reading book *Stripes*.

~During Literacy Centers we:

- identified initial sounds and corresponding letters
- read a Thanksgiving book practicing our one to one matching and looking for high frequency words.
- listened to a Thanksgiving story about a very silly turkey and drew and wrote about our favorite part.
- practiced reading and writing high frequency words
- met in small groups with Mrs. Mikalsen to play phonemic awareness games, read decodable books and read patterned books.

~Fundations - This week's letters: I~lamp~/I/, h~hat~/h/ and k~kite~/k/. We are learning to match letters with their sounds, write letters on our dry erase slates and attend to stories. We also practiced discriminating the number of words in a sentence and changing key words in sentences to change their meaning.
