Language Arts:

~We looked for the Word of the Week: <u>like</u> in our books, poems and messages

~We are reading lots of books in small groups. We also read an emergent reader filled with high frequency words and a cute gingerbread man.

~We enjoyed lots of gingerbread themed activities this week. We:

- read and compared different versions of The Gingerbread Man
- designed our own gingerbread person
- played an ABC version of Candy Land
- created letters and words on playdough gingerbread mats.
- found matching rhyming pairs in a gingerbread sensory bin.
- used our 5 sense to explore and describe a gingerbread cookie

~We continued to work on writing more personal narratives. We are really focusing on telling our stories orally first, and then recording our ideas using words and pictures.
