#### 5512.01 Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (Revised & Mandated)

Strauss Esmay Associates was informed by one school district that QSAC reviewers recommended several minor revisions to their Harassment, Intimidation, and Bullying (HIB) Policy. The reviewers recommended these minor revisions to Policy Guide 5512.01 that Strauss Esmay provided to school districts in February 2009. These few revisions to the February 2009 version of the HI B Policy Guide were the only HIB revisions brought to our attention as the February 2009 version is consistent with the most recent guidance published by the New Jersey Department of Education. We believe the February 2009 version was universally accepted throughout the State. Notwithstanding this fact, Strauss Esmay Associates has incorporated these revisions into the HIB Policy Guide for district consideration.

#### 6360 - Political Contributions (Revised & Mandated)

Policy Guide 6360 has been revised and updated to the most recent guidance provided by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (DCA) and Political Contribution Disclosure (PCD) Forms. The revisions in this Policy Guide are consistent with the DCA's most recent Local Finance Notice on Board of Education contracting issues. The revised Guide provides clarification on some issues as the only change is a revision requiring a PCD form for contracts in excess of \$17,500 with an "Approved In-State Private School for the Disable
