Report of Incidents of Violence, Vandalism, and Substance Use SY 2008-2009 October 5, 2009

Pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:17-46, all schools districts are required to provide a public hearing on all acts of violence, vandalism, and substance abuse which occurred in the school district during the previous school year.

The data I am about to present is based on state-mandated reports completed by our building principals. Using definitions and guidelines provided by the New Jersey Department of Education, principals are responsible for reporting all qualifying incidents of violence, vandalism, or substance use. The reports are then submitted to the Assistant Superintendent who must then review them, and ultimately is responsible for ensuring that they are electronically submitted to the New Jersey Department of Education.

During the 2008-2009 school year, the Flemington-Raritan Regional School District experienced an unduplicated count of nine incidents in our schools that met the reporting criteria established by the Department of Education. These incidents are categorized as follows:
