Policy Guide 6360 has been revised and updated to the most recent guidance provided by the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs (DCA) and Political Contribution Disclosure (PCD) Forms. The revisions in this Policy Guide are consistent with the DCA's most recent Local Finance Notice on Board of Education contracting issues. The revised Guide provides clarification on some issues as the only change is a revision requiring a PCD form for contracts in excess of \$17,500 with an "Approved In-State Private School for the Disable
