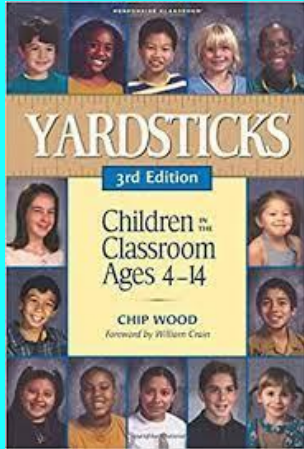

Age 12

Students are often unpredictable and hard to read as they swing between childhood and adulthood. Their greatest need is to be with peers.

Age 13

Typical age of rapid growth in mind and body, an age of contrast and confusion. Thirteen years olds are often pushing away adults as well as seeking them.

Age 14

Begin to distance themselves from adults. Need their own adult personalities to emerge. Typically have a keen interest in solving problems, more willingness to admit errors and often have a striking sense of humor.

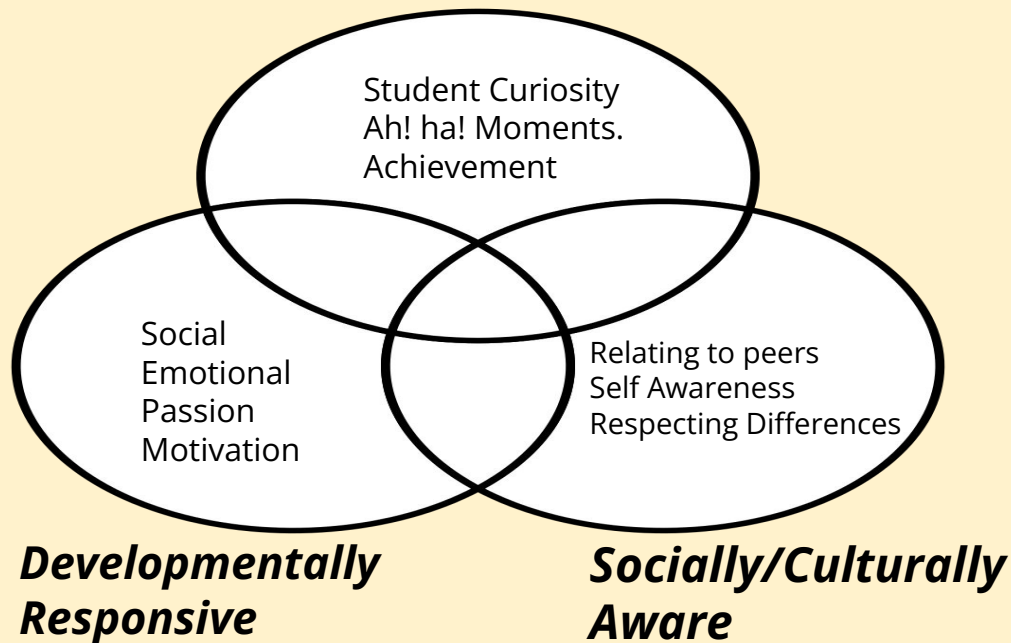
The Goal of J.P. Case Middle School:

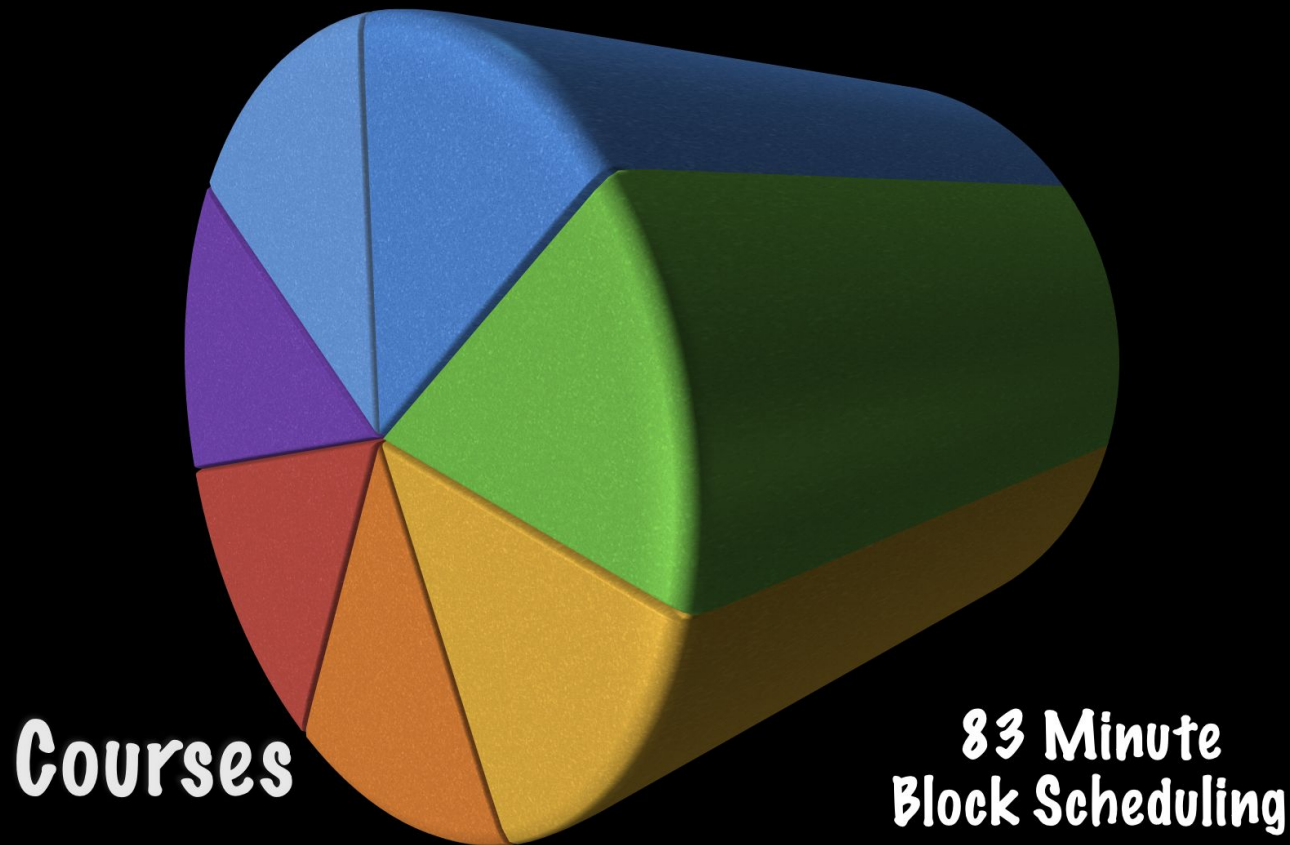

Student team entries were due in April. Submissions were reviewed by a panel of judges that included educators and representatives from non-profits, state agencies, and the partner organizations. Entries from students in grades 6 – 8 were placed in the Middle School category and students in grades 9 – 12 were placed in the High School category. Submissions from schools within Atlantic City Electric (ACE) territory were considered for the ACE Student Climate Challenge awards and all other submissions were considered for the NJ Student Climate Challenge awards.
